

The communities on the northwest outskirts of Minneapolis combine the best of Minnesota — close enough to the big city to offer easy urban access, but also situated right on the doorstep of the great outdoors. Here's why winter is the best time of year to take advantage.

### 1. We love our winter sports.

If outdoor sports like fat biking and skijoring aren't in your vocabulary, it's time you

experienced a Minnesotan winter. Head to Elm Creek Park Reserve and enjoy 13 miles of snowy trails for fat biking and skijoring or take on the hills of Elm Creek Winter Recreation Area, where there are 10+ miles of cross-country ski trails, as well as beginners' snowboarding and downhill skiing. Brooklyn Park's 160-acre Coon Rapids Dam Regional Park offers snowshoeing and cross-country skiing, and you may even see area deer.

If you're into ice skating, one favorite spot is Maple Grove's Central Park Ice Skating Loop. It's an ice trail — one of only a handful in North America — that winds through a park in the heart of the city. Rent skates and hit the ice. If you like to slap a puck or two while you're on your skates, check out the Brooklyn Park ice arenas.



### 2. Did someone say Polar Plunge?

Yep, there's an annual Polar Plunge held right here in Minneapolis Northwest. Participants leap into freezing cold water, only to resurface with the color and form of a popsicle, all to raise money for Special Olympics Minnesota. Last year, more than 600 Plungers raised more than \$200,000 at the Maple Grove Polar Plunge. Mark your calendar for the 2018 event on Feb. 3!

### 3. Get ready to hit up some of Minnesota's best stores.



Okay, we have more than just cold – you'll find cozy stores, like Nordstrom Rack and GAP, with designer goods in the Arbor Lakes Shopping District. And the Mall of America's 520 stores? Less than 30 minutes away. You'll also find tremendous fashion bargains at Albertville Premium Outlets. Perfect Levi's 501s and velvet boots from Nine West? Check. There's also Cabela's, home to all the outdoor and camping goods you would ever want or need.

### 4. WhirlyBall takes bumper cars to the extreme.

If you haven't heard of it, WhirlyBall combines lacrosse, hockey, and basketball ... all while sitting inside a bumper car. Two teams of five players each try their best to score in the basketball-style hoop. There's only one location in Minnesota where you can take your WhirlyBall skills to the next level and that's WhirlyBall Twin Cities in Minneapolis Northwest. Give it a go and just try to tell us you didn't enjoy it.



### 5. The food scene could satisfy even the Minnesota Jolly Green Giant.

Zagat placed Minneapolis above Seattle and Miami as the 11<sup>th</sup> best food city in the country last year, so you know the dining in this part of the world is exciting. From crawfish étouffée and fried frog legs at Crazy Cajun, to papaya salad and roast duck curry at Lemon Grass Thai, and mostaccioli at Sweet Taste of Italy (all in Brooklyn Park), you'll find plenty of amazing meals in Minneapolis Northwest.





In the land of 10,000 theatres, Minneapolis Northwest boasts one of the best. Learn more about the local founders of Yellow Tree Theatre who are thrilled to celebrate the theatre's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Yellow Tree Theatre was founded in 2008 by theatre and husband/wife artists team Jason Peterson and Iessica Lind Peterson who had the dream of enhancing the arts community in the Minneapolis Northwest area. "Looking back, we were pretty crazy to start up in 2008, but sometimes you have to be a little crazy in order to realize your dreams," Jessica says. She



currently works as the Associate Artistic and Development Director, and Jason works as the Executive Artistic Director. Both occasionally act in their productions and Jessica is an active playwright.

Yellow Tree's Osseo location gives it a welcoming small-town feel. You're greeted with twinkling lights when you enter the lobby and are invited to partake in concessions (including a wine bar) while viewing its charming collection of books, décor and local art. The 120-seat theatre is a modern operation with state-of-the-art lighting and sound equipment, and the intimate space makes you feel like you're practically on stage with the actors.

The performances at Yellow Tree vary from quirky comedies and musicals to original plays and classic shows – many of which explore the complexity of the human spirit. The theatre is also known for its entertaining holiday performances, and Jessica has written all of them throughout the last decade. "I do love writing for the holidays because people are in the mood to celebrate and laugh with their families and friends," she says.



"I love writing comedy and writing about Minnesota, and the freedom to be silly as a writer is just so wonderful."

The theatre has come a long way from its humble beginnings and is considered a major player in the

regional theatre scene. In 2016, Yellow Tree was among just seven other theatres across the country awarded a National Theater Company Grant from the American Theater Wing, the same organization that runs the Tony Awards. "It was an incredible honor and so gratifying to know that our work in Osseo, Minnesota, is being recognized on a national level," Jessica says. The theatre has also been recognized as the "Best Place to Find Unexpected Great Theater" by the *Star Tribune* (2014).

As part of their efforts to make live theatre accessible for all, Yellow Tree offers a variety of ticket discounts, such as their Young&Free ticket program for the 25 and under crowd and \$10 rush tickets (but beware – most shows sell out!). Discounts are also available for seniors, military veterans and students, and folks can even sign up to be a volunteer usher and see a performance for free.

Yellow Tree Theatre is much more than a theatre. Its passionate founders continually deliver high-quality storytelling to the local community and enrich the arts landscape

of Minnesota. "It's been a wild ride throughout the past 10 years, but it's very gratifying to know that we have really become a strong artistic presence in our community and in the Twin Cities overall," Jessica says.

Whether you've been to Yellow Tree Theatre before, have always wanted to check it out, or have never heard of it, now is the time to go!





# Cooking His Way to the Top: Get to Know Pat Lundgren, Executive Chef at Minneapolis Marriott Northwest



Working your way up to Executive Chef at a premier hotel isn't easy, especially before the age of 30, but it helps that Pat Lundgren always knew he wanted to work in a kitchen. The Brooklyn Park native graduated from Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts in Minneapolis and began working as a prep cook and off-site caterer before joining the Minneapolis Marriott Northwest in 2013. Once he started, Pat quickly advanced to Sous Chef, Executive Sous Chef and, at last, Executive Chef.

The Minneapolis Marriott Northwest is one of the most well-recognized hotels in the Twin Cities and outer suburbs. With a top-quality restaurant, Wadsworth, and more than 62,000-square feet of event space, it takes a master Executive Chef and a superb kitchen and wait staff to pull

off everything from a quaint 10-person breakfast in the restaurant, to catering a 500-person event in the hotel's largest space, the Northland Ballroom. Logistics are particularly complex, and it's up to Pat and his sous chefs to determine what they need for equipment, staffing, and creative solutions when challenges arise.

Amy Lewis, Minneapolis Marriott Northwest's Director of Sales and Marketing, is often impressed with the number of events Pat works on. "Pat and his team regularly serve multiple parties each weekend, sometimes producing up to 1,000 meals at a time," Amy says. "To maintain the quality and creativity he does with the number of guests that we serve is a testament to his hard work and dedication to the hotel."

Wadsworth changes its menu four times throughout the year to highlight seasonal flavors, ingredients and dishes with a

Minnesota twist. "When a company holds an event at the Marriott and is inviting people from all over the country, even world, they want to show off some of the local favorites," he says, chicken "including wild rice soup and casseroles."



To keep menus fresh and interesting, Pat gets his creative inspiration by attending events for foodies and other chefs. "We all want to show off our new creations and see what others are doing," he says. When asked if he watches cooking shows to get the creativity flowing, Pat said he doesn't. But after a slight pause he confesses he has watched Guy Fieri's "Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives." He says he enjoys watching lesser-known restaurants, family owned places and even food trucks get highlighted, and

notes that sometimes the best food is where you'd least expect to find it.

What makes this Executive Chef feel successful is not having the title at such a young age, but receiving positive feedback from diners and guests, particularly from the larger events, from conferences to trade shows to

weddings. He shares the glowing reviews with his staff, and he is quick to point out that his sous chefs, prep cooks and all others are the ones that truly keep the restaurant and the banquets going.

Outside of the Marriott, Pat and his wife are busy raising their two young daughters. They live in Brooklyn Park on an acre of land that offers a welcome respite from the frenzied kitchens, and they wouldn't have it any other way.



Central Park in Maple Grove is a hotspot for family fun! There is an awesome (and very large) playground that looks like a dream come true to kids of all ages (and their parents). Central Park has sweeping lawns, trails, pickleball courts, a splash pad, and more. Enjoy a stroll around the gardens and labyrinth as you look for flowers in bloom. From the nearly one-mile trail around the park, you can access 55 miles of Maple Grove trails! And it's free! For a small fee, you can rent pickleball, bean bags and bocce ball equipment.

Elm Creek Park Reserve offers nature and learning. With miles of trails to explore, a gigantic playground, the Eastman Nature Center, programs for children (and adults), it is the perfect way to spend a sunny afternoon! Get lost in nature on the park's more than 20 miles of hiking trails and watch for wildlife, from eagles and sandhill cranes to beavers and loons, as they come out of their winter hibernation! Are you tired of seeing the word 'free'? Good, because Elm Creek Park Reserve and Eastman Nature Center are both free!

After all the excitement and running around, it's nice to have some quiet activities lined up too. An often overlooked option is the movies! Maple Grove has an awesome AMC movie theater that offers first-run movies, a fun and entertaining way to spend a couple of hours.



# Fun Date Night Ideas in Minneapolis Northwest

1. Sip and snuggle. OMNI Brewing Co. continues to be one of the most popular hangouts in Minneapolis Northwest. Cool craft beers like Loonacy and A Little Hoppy are brewed on-site, and you can take a brewery tour when you call in advance. Have your date coincide with any one of the brewery's special events, such as Food Truck Fridays and Saturdays, Infuseday Tuesdays, live music nights, taproom yoga or trivia nights. When the patio is open, snuggle outside near the fireplace on a cozy couch or play a friendly game of bean bag toss or shuffleboard.



2. Dress up for dinner. Book a table at a classy restaurant, such as awardwinning Travail Kitchen & Amusements in Robbinsdale, a gastropub serving Midwest-inspired fare. About Travail, Bon Appetit magazine said: "They've got the best house-made charcuterie, crazylow prices, and smart, ambitious food." Arrive early for a drink at the bar, where the cocktails are as creative as the food presentations. Also consider Patrick's Bakery & Café or 3 Squares Restaurant in Maple Grove. Each offers delicious menus, fine baked goods and lovely patios for outdoor dining. And nothing quite sets the mood like dining at an upscale steakhouse like Pittsburgh Blue in Maple Grove. Split a bottle of wine over a savory meal of steaks, chops or ribs, and don't forget dessert!

3. Paint a masterpiece. You don't have to be Van Gogh to have a great date night at the Paint Pub. Named one of the trendiest nights out in the Twin Cities, the Paint Pub is an art studio café where you and your date can create a featured painting by following the steps provided by the instructor. Sample wine or beer as you paint side-by-side and compare and contrast your final works of art. The studio also has sandwiches, snacks and desserts, so you and your date can grab a bite before, during or after you paint.



4. Explore the great outdoors. Elm Creek Park Reserve is the bee's knees for outdoor dates. During warmer months, play a game of disc golf on their 18-hole course, have a picnic or take a dip in the chlorinated swimming pond. During colder seasons, explore the park's winter wonderland on cross-country skis, fat bikes or tubes. Also include Eastman Nature Center in your itinerary for a casual stroll on the floating boardwalk and a visit to the newly renovated nature center. Depending on the time of year, you may see trumpeter swans, wild turkeys, bluebirds, foxes, deer, and abundant native wildflowers.



5. Compete for the dinner bill. You already know that Dave & Buster's is a popular place for kids, but did you know it has adults-only hours? It's true, which means you and your date can compete against each other in old-fashioned pinball, Dance Dance Revolution or auto racing to see who picks up the tab. And you won't strike out if you take your date to Bowlero in Brooklyn Park. 

When asked what keeps him motivated and inspired, Hector said the interaction with the crowd is one of his favorite things. He loves when people ask questions and get involved in the process. "If even just one kid walks away and is inspired to create something, that would be amazing for us."

The Chalk Guys believe that once a piece has been brought to life, it's done. It isn't fun recreating the same thing, and they want each piece to be unique. Which means that if you miss them at Chalkfest this year, you'll NEVER see what they created. Don't miss it!

So, what do The Chalk Guys do besides create incredible art? Both have families and full-time jobs. Hector is a graphic artist and Ken is a web developer. They both take art classes at local colleges to build their repertoire of skills. Even their hobbies are creative: Hector plays the bass; Ken is a drummer; and both are involved with bands.

Do The Chalk Guys have any advice for people attending Chalkfest? "People tend to come on the second day only. But the process is part of the fun! You'll miss out on the full experience because this is truly a unique opportunity to watch artists create in front of you." 








flavor and is increasingly known as the best place to get crawfish in the Twin Cities. A cowboy hat-wearing crawfish greets you as you walk in, along with a mouth-watering garlic and spice aroma. Several tables in the dining area have built-in buckets for your shells, so you know this place is serious about seafood. You'll also notice that Crazy Cajun is crazy about the Minnesota Vikings, and many Vikings players visit this eatery during the football season for a true southern-style feast fit to feed a king.

Crazy Cajun's menu overflows with choices. Start by nibbling on tasty appetizers, such as Crab Balls and Boudin Balls, each deep-fried to perfection. Additional southern starters include gator bites, fried oysters, frog legs and crawfish pie, or start with a cup of seafood or chicken and sausage gumbo.

The real star of the menu is the seafood boil where you can choose from crawfish, mussels, king crab, blue crab, snow crab, clams, and jumbo shrimp. (The crawfish and blue crab are seasonal, so you may want to call ahead of time if you're looking for these specific boils.) Once you select your meat for the boil, pick one of two sauces - the house garlic butter sauce (Cajun-style) or the



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coco sauce made of sweet coconut cream, garlic, butter, and basil leaf. Add on to your seafood boil with halved ears of sweet corn, hunks of potatoes or pork sausage. Bonus tip: plastic bibs and wet-naps are available!

For something a little less crazy at Crazy Cajun, try out one of the many fried baskets available and choose from jumbo butterfly shrimp, walleye fillets, catfish fillets, popcorn shrimp, and oysters. Sides of thick crinkle fries and hush puppies, made with savory cornmeal batter and chopped onions, round out the generous portions.



It's hard to imagine a Louisiana-style restaurant without po' boys ... which is why Crazy Cajun has delicious po' boys stuffed to the gills with your choice of shrimp, crawfish, catfish, or oysters. Located 15 minutes from downtown Minneapolis sits Mississippi Gardens, an elegant premier wedding and event center overlooking the Mississippi River. It's the realization of Jamie Leopold's dream of running a family business and making fairytale events come true.

Jamie had wanted to own her own event center and help make fairytale weddings come true, and the couple kept their eyes on the property that would eventually become Mississippi Gardens.



Obtaining the property was a complex and lengthy process, and Jamie also knew how important it was to gain the support and trust of the neighborhood's residents. She went door-to-door with a drawing of a wedding that her daughter had made and talked with folks oneon-one, sharing their family's plans and listening to both the encouragement and concerns of the residents. All of this happened while Jordan was still playing hockey and Jamie was looking after their four children. When asked how they got through it, Jamie laughs and says, "There was certainly a lot of learning along the way, a lot of trial and error."

The result of Jamie's hard work is Mississippi Gardens – close to five acres of lush, beautiful land sprinkled with flower beds and towering trees, and an 11,000-square foot building with wood beams and floor-to-ceiling windows. The 2,076-square foot deck ties it all together, providing stunning panoramic views of the Mighty Mississippi. The property is part of the National Park Service and the Leopolds work with the Department of Natural Resources to ensure the riverbanks and wildlife are protected.

Mississippi Gardens also maintains a solid partnership with Mintahoe Catering & Events, the exclusive caterer of the venue. Erin Hegedus, Event Consultant for Mintahoe, says working with the Leopolds is like being with family. "Once I met them I couldn't have asked for a better situation," Erin says. "They are so down to earth, straightforward and honest, and they would give the shirt off their backs to you."

While Mississippi Gardens identifies primarily as a wedding facility, Jamie wants businesses and organizations to

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know that during the week their space is perfect for all kinds of events – from meetings and lunches, to team-building activities and training days. They provide a full set of audio-visual equipment for speeches, slideshows and presentations, and delicious catering from Mintahoe. Groups often find the space a welcome change from a typical meeting room, and in the warmer months, groups can take advantage of the grounds with bean bag toss, bocce ball and golf putting.

With a booming business and now five children, Jamie and Jordan are busier than ever and Mississippi Gardens continues to be a family oriented endeavor. "They are very present, even when initial tours are being done," Erin says. "When a client comes into the space, they know they are cared for and they are welcomed into the Mississippi Gardens family."

Let's not forget about the Minnesota United FC soccer team! They are opening their own stadium in 2019, but that doesn't mean you can't


